just even for a while

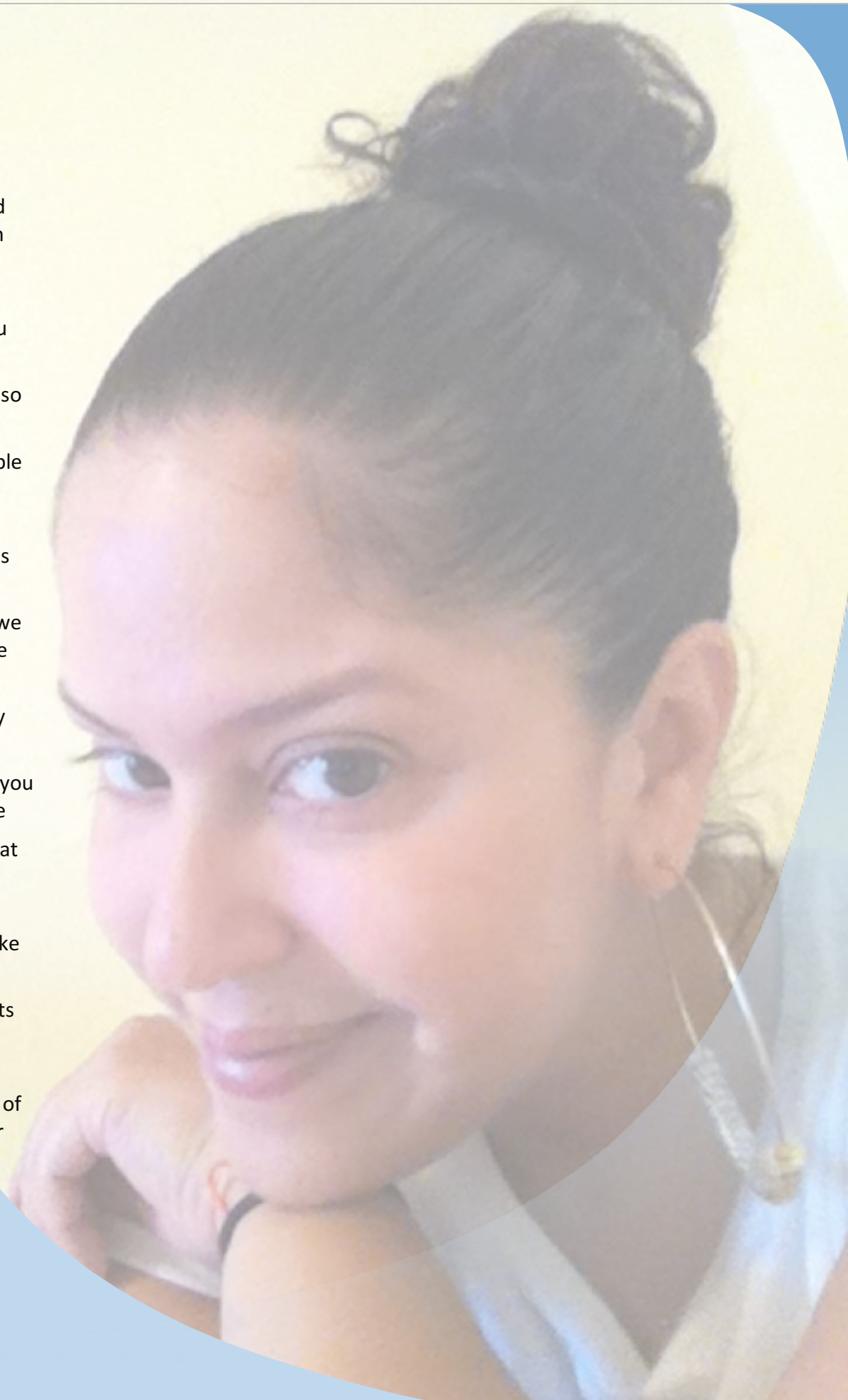
I'll say goodbye and kiss you
